## AGM

## **Open Meeting**

- 3. Winter Ethics Committee is going well, with BMC in Manchester looking at environmental issues. Stoney Croft Ghyll is faced with an erosion issue. Fencing is to be installed and a sign put up. Chains will be installed to avoid trashing the ghyll. The new land owner at Church Beck, Coniston wants to start charging people to go up the ghyll. The BMC has a new Landscape Charter (see website) It will deal with such issues as fracking and wind farms. Access and Conservation Trust have applied for funding to 'fix the fells' Dalehead Tarn to Dalehead path. No objection from the floor. A quarry in the Duddon near Ulpha has been found to have bolts. Its owner wants them removed. Lakes area not getting involved.

**Broadstand** the guidebook description is to be to be 'un-gradable.' The bolts that were in place have been removed. It was noted that it is highly polished and very dangerous. A suggestion that maybe a ladder be installed was not well accepted. FRCC are contacting Cicerone and requesting that they include in the scrambling guidebook that it is unsafe. Wasdale MR are not in favour of having any permanent protection in place. Carey Davis (BMC Hill Walking rep) pointed out that walkers are aware of the dangers in the mountains and that the safety on Broadstand becomes an educational issue. He felt a ladder was not the answer.
