North Wales Area Meeting:

- No issues arising from previous meetings minutes
- Elfyn Jones tells us that the dry tooling and fixed equipment document is now in the pipeline
- Elfyn Jones raises new information on the Welsh Government Access Legislation Review
 The green paper has been delayed until the end of January

- -Objections have been put forward in a large volume in an orchestrated manner from angling and land owner groups
- -Possible reduction in public footpath quality and maintenance if a bill goes ahead
- -Elfyn proposed formatting a letter to send to lobby MPs with
- KC proposed the club committee rep does some lobbying
- National Resources Wales announce winter climbing service at Ogwen. A device will check earth and air temperature readings and the information from these will go on-line to help climbers decide whether conditions are 'in' or not. The service will be mainly experimental this year but a positive development
- Lew Costello raises the point that there is an obvious lack of BMC information in YHA properties i.e. flyers, leaflets, notice board information
- Dates of Tremfest next year to be brought forward to allow more vegetation to grow. May 17-18th suggested

Access Updates:

- Chris Doyle's film 'Fresh Meat' has raised major issues of climbers damaging vegetation.
 Footage clearly shows individuals abseiling down and 'cleaning' vegetation in a SSSI –
 Natural Resources Wales have been consulting Elfyn Jones over this issue
- At Range West the military have restricted access to a max of 30 people per day Suggested that the fewer numbers visiting the area is due to the bureaucracy involved with attending access meeting
- In Llandulas there have been parking issues with local residents on the road climbers often park. Suggested that climbers now park elsewhere to avoid troubling residents

2014 area meetings:

- 5 meetings suggested for 2014 to allow greater opportunities for people to attend
- Point raised that the further the meetings are from the 'hub' of Llanberis the fewer attendees. Proposed that more meetings are in Llanberis next year

 - -April meeting in Heights
 - -June meeting in Llandudno (venue tba)
 - -September venue tba
 - -November venue tba
