**Caley** – now very overgrown with Himalayan Balsam & bracken. Needs climbers to carry secateurs & do their bit to help control growth.

**The Roost** – Access now banned due to some climbers accessing crag via private garden on crag top & parking on private drive.

Blue Scar & Foredale Quarry – situation unchanged.

**Threshfield Quarry** – No definitive reply as yet from the quarry company.

**Langcliffe Quarry** – Proposal to be developed re climbing in the Quarry.

The Climbing Barn - Future uncertain after notice to guit premises at end of lease period.

## BMC subscriptions –

Suggestion re regular RPI related increases not supported.

Proposal for increases only when needed & with transparency re reasons for increase. Vote taken – 27 for, none against & 2 abstentions (apparently 9 people who neither voted nor indicated abstention)

## Hill walking Strategy –

Clear definition needed re where 'rambling' stops & hill walking starts. BMC should focus on representing walkers in hill & mountain areas & not all walkers.

Partnership working with other organisations eg Ramblers' Association, HF Holidays etc

Proposal as per Midlands Area Meeting – "The Yorkshire Area proposes that the BMC sets up a working group, made up of representatives from each area, to support the Executive in implementing a strategy for hill walking to emulate, and not diminish, the excellent service already provided to climbers, better to serve and inform our hill walking members and to attract new members."

Meeting voted in support of this proposal with one vote against & no abstentions.
