4. Key issues discussed:

Increased access to public paths for cyclists. Please see bullet points below.

Almscliff. Recent use as nightime/lamping climbing venue. Farmer has asked that Almscliff not be used as a night-time climbing venue. RAD updated accordingly.

Shelter Cliff Field Boulders Access. Report that climber asked by farmer not to climb there. Private land.

Crookrise. BMC acquisition imminent – definitely before Christmas.

Blue Scar. Previous reports of some confusion re gaining permission to climb. Access Rep will review in 2017. Noted that email contact details for landowner are on BMC's RAD.

Communication between Areas & NC on policy/development issues. Please see bullet points below.

Sport England's Code for Sports Governance & SE funding. Just brief mention of this with some discussion re impact if SE funding lost.

Bullet points for highlighting to the National Council:

Increased access to public paths for cyclists.

Meeting understands that BMC has to consider this & doesn't object at this stage but various concerns were expressed & support would depend upon seeing the details of any final proposal. For increased access to work good signage & management of paths would be key, as would a good understanding of anticipated future usage & observation of best practice/a code of conduct by users.
