4. Matters arising from the previous meeting

7. Accidents in the county (Northumberland) – Updates

Funding: Dave Turnbull has agreed to fund two training days with two instructors on each of

the days

Location One day north or Tyne (Bowden suggested) and one day south Tyne (Wainstones

(taller) or Scugdale)

Dates: North of Tyne: earlier better prior to students leaving Uni. Mid April proposed.

South of Tyne: Tie it in with the Festival of Climbing. (MC / FC to take forward).

Registration To get a grasp on numbers Rob Dyer suggested asking for intent using web forms (he

can advise)

Itinerary: Open agenda days but must it is not about being taught to climb, but it is about

safety techniques and fragility of natural rock.

Promotion: Publicity is the key. BMC Marketing team can assist. FB, etc.

Participants: Open to all, promote through uni / local walls / clubs.

Youth: Consult with Nick Colton in terms of issues regarding young people. E.g.

safeguarding, parental / guardian permission, DBS etc.

Project lead: JP noted his conflict of interest owing to commercial interest, however, members

were happy for him to lead.

Next steps: JP will circulate plans prior to next meeting.

Noted: -Cumbria are running outdoor courses for youth (but they are picky about who they choose).

- BMC, run a number of youth courses with James McCaffie (albeit further south).

8. Co-ordinators reports

Access

- New Regional Access Database massively updated with increased functionality including: photos, pdf, user comments, topos, weather feed, tidal feed, parking info, a map based system where data and pins can be dropped, almost all crags included. https://www.thebmc.co.uk/modules/RAD/
- Dogs on access land. Owners permitted to restrict dogs to short leads at certain times and apply for 5 year bans.
- 28 day access restrictions can be enforced (incl. Esklets, Simonside and Ravensheugh) (often happen midweek March April). Problems with advertising. Restrictions, however, don't apply to public rights to way and cannot be on weekends and holidays

National Council accepted recommendations of Hillwalking Working Group. Strategic Plan and Report circulated.

MA reported – Sport England made enthusiastic noises about potentially funding the first year of implementation of the strategy.

National Council (Jon Punshon and Mark Anstiss)

JP: The BMC have given a new 1 year post of Commercial Rep to Simon Lee. His remit is to seek to raise funds for the BMC in the light of diminishing funding from Sports Council. NC – encouraged him think big in terms of linking with commercial organisations (e.g Landrover etc), though not with organisations which may cause jealousy within the outdoors sector. Need to find ways of getting foot into doors: - ideas welcomed.

MA:

December NC:

- Major item was terms of reference for the committees. Accepted without major revisions.
- Discussions re: raising sub fees

JanuaryNC.

- South Wales now a separate area.
- Discussions about how the BMC works. Ie it is a democratic organisation where the NC is the policy making body and the executive are responsible for making things happen operationally. However, in

reality governance is muddied. Sport England commented on this and a Working Group will be formed outside of NC and the Executive to look at this.

- The meeting was asked whether members considered the BMC democratic?
- CB: Youth unhappy that split and amalgamation of youth competitions in the north without consultation.

Overall (in the light of the Climb Britain fiasco) information flow is the issue. I.e. asking what member think.

- Hillwalking Strategy accepted in full.
- Graeme Richmond new treasurer
- Vice President: Libby Peters rescinded interest in the role. Gender balance an issue.
- New patrons. Examining gender balance in these roles would be positive.
- AGM: Scheduled for 22 Apr2017. All welcome to attend.
- Sub increases. NC approved an increase of £2.50 for individual members and £1 for affiliate clubs members. Context forecast c.a. £ 100,000k deficit.
- Olympics: UK Sport will get back to BMC in Sept about funding for the Olympics.

Youth Report

Irish Lead Climbing Championships, Londonderry 26th November 2016

Sam Bullock travelled to Londonderry to take part in the Irish Lead Climbing Championships and brought home a Silver Medal in the Boys Cat A Group. This adds to the Gold medal he previously won in Ireland.

New Year Climb, Sunderland 2nd January 2017

Rock Solid help a training day at Sunderland wall over the New Year holidays, in preparation for this year's YCS. Invites went out to our old colleges from Cumbria, as well as our new friends in Yorkshire.

Both areas attended, and I am please to report that the 3 families that made the trip up from Yorkshire seemed to be suitable impressed with what Rock Solid had to offer and reported this back to other parents in Yorkshire.

YCS Round 1, Huddersfield 28th January 2017

72 Young Climbers took part in round 1.

This was the first chance Rock Solid had to speak directly to all of the entrants of this year's YCS. The Yorkshire region does not have a support group of their own, so this was our chance to explain who we are, what we do and ask those that wish to join us. The Staff at Huddersfield Climbing Centre put on a warm welcome and allowed us to put up posters for Rock Solid around the climbing centre, which attracted a lot of interest.

Rock Solid 2017 Team Kit

The new BMC North East & Yorkshire region required new team kit for this year's Youth Team.

Having discussed designs with the people of Yorkshire, who felt that they would like to keep the Yorkshire Rose in the design, we incorporated this but into In order to balance the design with the North East we felt that an emblem of our own was required, so we enquired if the Angel of the North could be used.
