3. Minutes of previous Meeting

Jon Punshon ran through the minutes from the previous meeting 16/02/2017. With two minor typing amendments, accepted as true and fair.

4. Festival of Climbing

- Trophies, however, had the wrong regional titles on (which, given the lack of consultation on redrawing the regions was not well received).
- Parents possibly getting a "little more involved" ie pushing from a collaborative venture in the past, towards a less friendly competitive feel.

7. Strategic Affinity Partnerships (SAPs)

On the request of Simon Lee information was disseminated about the development of SAPs. Questions arose around:

- the risk of downsides: i.e dubious practices, exploitation of workers, pollution, risk of future scandal and the consequences and impact on the BMC,
- What is the alternative? Fees raises / service cuts (context: by 2021 no Sport England funding). Being seen to be fair to all with many funders (and thereby keep all sweet)?
- Does the changes to governance and structure impact upon the whole organisation and the funding provided by SAPs? Ie could funding be stovepiped? Are we sponsoring the team or the BMC?

Given the risks and sense of unease a vote was not taken on the suggested question: 'Are you in favour of the BMC **developing** [stress added] affinity partnerships?'

Instead a vote was taken on:

Supporting the BMC <u>investigating</u> affinity partnerships (on the condition that the process is cautious, democratic and transparent and that due diligence is undertaken)

Motion passed: 11 for, 1 against, 1 abstain.

8. National Council

Mark Anstiss updated:

- No NC meeting since last area meet
- Next meeting on the Sunday morning after AGM.
- Governance Working Group totally unrelated to vote of no confidence

9. Vote of No Confidence

The nature of vote of no confidence by Bob Pettigrew et al discussed. This included information in the public domain about the vote. In addition, context (such as Sport England and governance, relationship between Exec and NC) and potential risks and consequences were discussed. It was stressed that members can vote with their own conscience. Feeling of the room was:

That the vote of no confidence is unwelcome unwarranted and damaging.

10. Governance

The nature of BMC governance was widely discussed. The problems of top-down bodies such as the FA were compared with the bottom-up structure of the BMC. The feeling of the room was:

Broad support for the bottom up structure of the BMC as is, even if this potentially means less funding and even if governance mistakes have been made in the past.

11. Strategic Plan

Mark Anstiss set out the timeline and disseminated a draft of the strategic plan.

Appendix 1

Clubs Report to NE area meeting 06th April 2017

Clubs committee last met at the BMC Offices, Manchester, on Thursday 9 March 2017. I was able to attend remotely via Skype. Key issues discussed were the Strategic Plan and the vote of no confidence

The Strategic Plan

The Clubs Committee put forward the following points directly to Dave Turnbull on the draft strategic plan:

- The heritage section should include a recognition of and support to maintain mountaineering huts as part of the rich heritage of clubs
- More emphasis on the need to grow membership to ensure the long-term sustainability of the BMC, particularly with the expected large reduction in Sport England funding
- Greater support is needed to promote the concept of a 'club' and the various guises that it can be, rather than just the pre-conception that they are only large national clubs
- Support is needed for existing clubs to capitalise on the opportunities available by linking with non-affiliated groups and growing their membership
- If a survey were to take place of clubs, then it should go to all club members not just the main club contact

An electronic version of the draft Plan has been shared with NE clubs to gather feedback - I have had no responses so far. Major comments need to be made by early April in preparation for the AGM and April National Council meeting. It is planned that the final plan will be approved at the June National Council Meeting.

The Vote of no-confidence

A mailing went to NE clubs explaining the vote of no confidence situation and encouraging them to support the BMC and request that their members do the same.

Clubs Training Day and Roadshows

The Training Day for Committee Members went very well with good feedback and requests for similar events. One Roadshow (Manchester) went well but two were cancelled due to low numbers.
