### **10. Co-ordinators Reports**

**Access North** 

- South Yardhope. Current access situation (requiring training) has not changed. History of two criminal convictions of trespass during red flag times. Franco Cookson awaiting feedback from MoD.
- Rothbury Quarry... a suggestion has been made that it may benefit from bolting.
  - Simon "is not thinking about bolting it" but does believe that it would benefit from bolts. Others, including Karl Telfer and Franco Cookson supportive
  - Steve Blake against it for three reasons:
    - Northumberland's unique status of no bolts (why lose it for the sake of Rothbury Quarry – Spittal Quarry recently freed of bolts).
    - If bolts were introduced it should be done on something worth getting on the first step on the bolting ladder.
    - Tried and failed already at Cockenheugh, Spittal, Cawfields.
