1. Mark Kemball welcomed everyone to the meeting.
2. Mark summarised the minutes of the last AGM, there were no matters arising.

Appendix A:

BMC SW area 2019 – 20 report.

Well, it's been an "interesting" year, completely overshadowed by covid...

At last year's AGM, James Mann was elected as chair and myself as secretary. In spring, James stood down and I took over as chair and Philip Wilson took over from me as secretary. This was agreed by the National Council. I'd like to thank James for all the work he did as chair and his continuing support for me in my new role. Henry Forrester has been our Walls rep, he too is standing down as he is no longer working in the industry, I'd like to thank him too, particularly for his support for our area youth co-ordinators in running the Youth Climbing Series.

In 2018, we decided to try, for one year running all our meetings in one central venue – The Quay, Exeter. In November 2019, we reviewed this and decided that at least one of our meetings should be held in Bristol and that whenever possible meetings should be held at a climbing wall. Well, just before the first lockdown we held an area meeting at Redpoint in Bristol, since then, meetings have been on line using Zoom – there are certainly advantages to this, especially in a large area like ours and it may well be that we decide to continue with this once things "get back to normal" (if they ever do). However, I for one, miss the chance to meet face to face and the accompanying "craic".

As a result of the pandemic, climbing has been somewhat limited this year, however a couple of issues have arisen. Bolts have appeared in South Devon contrary to the current fixed gear policy. We are trying to address this issue (see later in the meeting).

"Wild Camping" and "Van Camping" by some inconsiderate / ill-educated individuals has resulted in significant littering in our area, particularly on Dartmoor and in West Cornwall. This does not seem to be improving.
