- Last Q, matters arising in Dartmoor about open access and wild camping, years grace introduced. More work centrally on maintaining the historic position
- Approaching new patrons, looking for broader representations.
- Referencing the debate in the SW about replacing pegs / not replacing, glued pegs
- Sport England bid, several positions available
- Just over 80,000 active BMC members, aim is 100,000
- YHA partnership established
- Move from farm payments to Environmental land managed scheme, improving access and recreation links well with BMC work
- Moors for the Future
- Yorkshire public transport crag access guide to reduce car use
- IFSC Lead & Speed Climbing World Cup held in Edinburgh, tickets sold out in 7 minutes, temporary structure considered to give other venues option rather than Ratho

7. Reports from Area Representatives

7.1 Gritstone: Access and Conservation Covered by

- Snowden access has still not been established but entry without damage to walls or fences should be fine. Some grease is still present on the holds so they still require cleaning with soap. Lamping has caused issues, already updated on RAD.
- Almscliff footpath needing some care at the bottom by the road, looking a bit boggy where stones have sunk.
- Crookrise shared wall had fallen down but the wall has been partially restored. The farmer has been informed and is responsible for the wall and will likely make a more comprehensive repair.

- Halton Heights. Bolted belays remain but bolts on the faces were cut.
- Brimham. The National Trust is introducing cattle onto the moor area of Brimham. Wire fences
 are due to go up. Aim of the cattle is to reduce the amount of silver birch saplings growing on
 the moor to prevent it becoming a forest. It was raised that cattle may try to shelter under some
 of the overhanging boulders, affecting landings, but the situation can be monitored when they
 are introduced.
- Pule Hill. Fence through the quarry. It was noted that this is on private property and the landowner is entitled to build a fence if they choose to do so.
- Shipley Glen clean up has been suggested after the success of the one at Baildon Bank. The council said they are happy to support it.
- There are issues with erosion at the base of Cubic block, the landowner for Cubic Block has been contacted to ask permission to attempt to repair some of the erosion but no response.
