Mountain Leader Training Wales

At a lively and well attended meeting in November the major points of discussion and for action were:

- The Ordnance Survey has a complaints procedure which should be used for highlighting concerns over crag markings on the newly published 1:25,000 Snowdonia maps, although in reply to initial complaints the OS did not feel there was an issue, as their other feedback had been positive. A standard comment would be useful to help other bodies who may wish to contact OS, thus ensuring that concerns were focused on the main issues; comments on clarity of map features to be forwarded to Bryn Willams at Siabod Cottage.
- Welsh Speaking Providers -Dewi Evans reported the increase of Welsh speaking participants in D of E activities, but there's a lack of instructors who can deliver courses through the medium of Welsh. Close working relationships with the Outdoor

Partnership (OP) would prove a good start for identifying talented Welsh instructors, who may be able to work alongside approved providers of ML and SPA courses to gain valuable experience and in future apply for providership. 10,000 people have now participated in events with the OP.

- The role of the MLTA in CPD provision was discussed.
- Andy Boorman(BMC Cymru/ Wales rep) was elected as Vice-Chair of MLTW.
