BMC Access Reps – Covid online meetings


- The BMC has arranged regular (initially weekly, then fortnightly) access rep conference calls during the pandemic.
- Aim has been to detect problems early, nip any issues in the bud, and provide timely guidance to local hillwalkers and climbers.
- PE as area sec has attended all these calls. NW area issues have been very few; participation enabled us to give NW climbers early notice via BMC NW Facebook page of any issues in Lakes, N Wales, Yorkshire or the Peak District.
- These FB posts have had very high reach figures, so as lockdown continues to ease, we will aim to transition this service
 to more of an "access news for NW climbers and hillwalkers", which we hope members will continue to find of interest
 and value.



- Northern Rock (Lancs, Yorks, North York Moors and Northumberland

 expected completion 2021. Lancs action photo gaps have been identified, photoshoots being scheduled. Volunteers welcome!
- Lancashire Rock: Further Developments now almost ready to go to the printers. It has several new route descriptions including full, updated guides to Noggarth and Winewall. The guide should be available at a small cost by late October/early November
- Yorkshire Sport supplement now available, £10.





Lancs Crags - 1

Cleanups

- Cleanup to be arranged at Wilton details TBD
- Loose block reported on route Flingle Bunt at Wilton 1 to be checked out.

Parking

- Potential issue / changed parking at Thorn Crag. Obey local signage for now, being investigated.
- Troy Qy during the week, only park on the road to the qy if you can do so without blocking locals and without parking directly in front of their houses. At weekends, or if parking full, park in a layby just on the Blackburn side of the cafe, then walk down on a track that starts close to the road and then runs parallel to it before veering off to the left to reach the normal access track. This adds about 10 mins each way
- Jumbles: Park as for Ousels and walk in
- Stronstrey Bank: Park at dam at end of Anglezarke Reservoir and walk in.
- Pinfold: no more than 2 cars.

Avoid or caution

- Outstanding access issues
 - Withnell Qy
 - Shore Qy
 - Pudsey Qy
 - Castle Qy
 - Lower Montcliffe
- Hall Stones Potential to upset locals

Other Lancs News -

- Query raised about the max number of cars at Witches. The correct number is 10 maximum. Please follow the other access instructions from the RAD to maintain good relations with the locals.
- Development work continues at Noggarth. There are now 60 routes there and one new buttress has recently been unearthed.
- The most obvious lines at Winewall have now been climbed, with two completely new buttresses opened up.
- Warton Main quarry Les Ainsworth & Dave Cronshaw have repaired the stile and debarbed the fence on the
 approach to Terrace Wall. They also cleaned up the path, which is now clear of brambles etc. Lancashire
 County Council which owns the quarry wants to remove all the cotoneaster non native species. Climbers are
 encouraged to remove any cotoneaster, particularly on the traverse from the right end of the Terrace Wall at
 The Playground (i.e. P1 of 68 Bouquet of Barbed Wire, or the last pitch of 24 Black Streak in reverse).

Cheshire Crags

No particular issues reported since last meeting:


Parking at Harmers Wood. As with any other venue – if the parking is full GO SOMEWHERE ELSE. Do not inconvenience locals.



Chew Valley

The Chew Valley still has very high numbers of day visitors, and parking and litter are ongoing problems. Blocking of some laybys by landowners is also a problem; access reps are aware.

New double yellow lines have been introduced in the Chew Valley, and elsewhere in the Peak (e.g. Yarncliffe) and in Snowdonia. Note that if you park on a verge where double yellow lines are in place, even if all 4 of your wheels are off the carriageway, you can still get ticketed.

A roundup of news -

Peak

- The hills and sport climbing venues continue to be busy. On the gritstone, crowds have not been an issue – but the midges have been!
- Take care parking for the Matlock quarries, issues have been reported
 (e.g. Masson Lees) which have the potential to threaten access.
- Bolt anchors have been installed at Aldery Cliff

Other Areas Access News - 2

North Wales

- High visitor numbers, "fly camping" and litter continue to be a problem in Snowdonia.
- Restrictions for climbing above the Marine Drive on the Great Orme finish today. The normal ticketing system is now back in use.
- The Diamond is now open, installing fixed cables for access.
- Tremadoc busy. It does not look like the café will re-open as a café, so "normal" parking has been lost. BMC reps looking at alternatives. Currently people are parking on the verge below Bwlch Moch seems to be working OK. The path to Grim Wall direct has been re-made.
- Castle Inn normal car park is closed. DO NOT move the barriers.
 See RAD for alternative car park.
- Snowdon Pen-y-pass. The normal car park has been closed and vehicles parked on the road near the summit of the Llanberis pass will be towed. Use the park and ride schemes. Latest – introducing prebooking scheme
- Gogarth north and south stack car parks are now open.
- Angel Bay, Little Orme important seal site. Avoid, check RAD.



Other Areas Access News - 3



Lakes


- As with Snowdonia high visitor numbers and litter are ongoing problems. The dry weather has resulted in some blocks near the top of climbs coming loose. Caution when topping out.
- Some littering reported at Hodge Close.

Yorkshire

- The Cow and Calf needs a cleanup, this will be organized.
- Yorkshire Sport climbing venues have been popular.

Organisation Development Group Workstream 7 - Clubs Working Group **Proposed Strategy for Clubs** 2020 - 2024

Our Goal

The BMC and Clubs work in partnership to promote our shared mission & values and support a thriving club community

Objective 1

The BMC actively seeks the views of clubs and promotes opportunities for clubs to contribute to national and local initiatives

Objective 2

The BMC facilitates inter-club networks, encourages sharing of good practice and promotes collaboration between clubs

Objective 3

The BMC focuses its resources to provide targeted, relevant support to address key priorities to ensure the health of clubs

Objective 4

The BMC recognises and engages with the broad range of clubs and volunteer groups that facilitate participation in mountain sports

Useful 'pilot' NW Area Clubs Zoom Chat – Priorities Ranked:

- Understand how Clubs can move towards re-starting meets and operating them safely in the 'new normal'
- Understand how Clubs can move to re-open huts with appropriate measures and risk assessment
- Ensure that Clubs derive maximum benefit from their BMC affiliation (and fees) and at the same time support the
 BMC in delivering its goals
- Share best practice in training for committee members and those 'leading' meets / activities, and how these can be refreshed and maintained
- Strategies for recruiting new (especially younger) members
- Achieving child protection (especially in huts) and allowing under 18 members
- Delivering equity in participation and membership
- Legal structures of Clubs (charity, Ltd company etc) especially regarding liability and risk etc

Re-starting meets and operating them safely in the 'new normal':

- Guidelines covering England and Wales have now been published https://thebmc.co.uk/covid19-restarting-club-meets
- Allows up to a maximum of 30 people to participate (actual numbers to be determined based on activity on an event-by-event / club-by-club basis)
- There is a risk assessment / check list which is intended to be as simple as possible
- Different guidance in England & Wales doesn't try to cover Scotland (see separate work from MCoS)
- Car sharing already subject to general published guidance / rules from governments and is NOT allowed at all in Wales and 'should be avoided where possible' in England, but is permissible with mitigating measures (probably only 2 people for practical purposes)
- Most of the Clubs represented were already experimenting with either ad-hoc groups (eg via WhatsApp or Facebook) or limited meets of up to 6 (or maybe 2 groups of 6) but there was some wariness of 'official meets'.

How Clubs can re-open huts with appropriate measures & risk assessment

- There is very clear guidance published on the website (and soon to be a recording of the recent webinar which is recommended viewing) https://www.thebmc.co.uk/covid19-reopening-huts
- Different regimes in England (max 2 households) and Wales (single household)
- Most of those present were experimenting with opening their huts Some general guidance includes allowing 72
 hours between occupations and clean on the way in and the way out
- General view was that there was so far little appetite for using huts as individual members remain cautious
- Clubs are generally restricting use to members only and requiring advanced booking
- Question if someone booking e.g. a single household then flouts the rules and brings more people, is the Club liable / insured. Answer So long as the Club has taken reasonable steps then they should be covered.

Hillwalking – organised walks


- Focus of SJC has been on conservation projects



BMC NW Facebook analytics – Headline findings

Most popula r posts

Posts with higher engagement were posts about

- ❖ localised access issues
- 'volunteer spotlight' profiles
- 'activity promotion' posts (crag clean-ups, post-area meeting summary post)



Little to no posts being shared (max 4)

Demographic s: location, gender and age group Little to no changes in demographic make up of those that engage with our page and posts. Same cities, same age and gender groups



Type of post: photos, videos, links

Video posts do consistently well in terms of reach (Q1 and Q2 reach of video posts between 200 and 600+, way above average for all-type posts)

In Q2, the two most liked/shared/read posts were 'status' posts about access

No substantial difference in post reach and engagement numbers pre- v during v post-lockdown

Overall engagement is increasing from Q4 2019 (likely due to posting schedule consistency and content relevancy)
