- 4. **BMC** (Fiona Sanders)
 - Pleased to announce Paul Davies has been appointed CEO after being interim

- 5. Impact of Covid-19 Post Lockdown
 - 2021 post lockdown plans from National Parks and influx of visitors (Richard Leafe LDNPA)
 - Authorities spent the winter digesting and learning from experiences in 2020
 - O Looks like 2021 will be busier!!
 - o Created a "Safer Lakes" website
 - Gives status of car parks
 - Increase the message to encourage people to plan ahead.
 - Marginal increasing in car parking provision
 - Issue of less car sharing going on!
 - Encourage to visit less visited areas
 - o "Safer Lakes"
 - Have permanent staff
 - Linked with multi-agencies

- 100 Visitor Management Volunteers
 - Located at major visitor points to give out information; get out the message about staying safe; do not litter or leave items on fells, lakeside etc
 - Educate people
 - More volunteers welcome.

Action point - BMC Lakes needs to promote website and need for volunteers

- After the end of lockdown has been relatively low numbers but starting to grow!
- O Looking to install additional **temporary toilets** in the area
 - Comment from Mike Parsons re only 3 public toilets between Patterdale and Pooley Bridge.
 - LDNPA would welcome ideas for locations.
- Contending with poor behaviour especially with flycamping and litter
- O Very grateful of all the people who are helping including Kate Willshaw & Friends of the Lakes and Nicola Bolton & Lakeland Plastic Collective.
- O Definitely not the case that everyone is behaving badly it is just a minority but a significant minority.
- o Following message of the recently issued **Countryside Code**.
- For those living in the National Park and nearby we have been lucky to live here particularly in lockdown.
- Many others have discovered the Lakes for the first time and are looking to return.
- The age profile of the visitor is lower than has been in the past and will likely lead to a lifetime of visits by many in the future.

Action point - BMC Lakes needs to promote

- Lakes Plastic Collective (Nicola Bolton)
 - Been busying working closely with LDNPA and other authorities.
 - More Flycamping reported via the Safer Lakes website has been useful.
 - Lakeshores are the main areas for issues
 - But also on the fells.
 - Visitors keen to help can direct to Alpkit
 - More issues with BBQs Nicola B counter 14/15 campfires by Honister Pass
 - Not usual visitors and not all disrespectful.

- Fires etc in Borrowdale Woods now area fenced off this is a shame but necessary
- Need more bins and bins emptying

 - The Great Cumbrian Litter Pick Friday 21st and Saturday 22nd May.

Action point - BMC Lakes needs to promote

- Research with Keep Britain Tidy campaign
 - Looking at Who and Why drop litter
 - 24 people admitted to dropping litter and being used in the survey
 - Full report not till end of May but issues coming through as follows
 - Inconvenience of carrying litter
 - o Bins full
 - Festival mentality that "others" will pick it up and keep place tidy
 - Ideas
 - Use of social media to get out message
 - Need to firm up message
 - Different message for different people
 - Highly need to "Take a bag"
 - BBQ's
 - Looking at best ways to dispose of BBQ's
 - Important to get out message of issues with BBQ's
 - National initiative to ban sale if portable BBQ's (a0 all together or (b) in dry conditions
 - Suggestion of having BBQ's at car park etc as in eg
 US, Australia or South Africa
 - Plastic bottles
 - Comment made about plastic bottles
 - Kate W commented on campaign to have deposit of plastic bottles
 - Want to get BMC to support this campaign.
 - Action point RK to follow up

O National Campaign

- Richard L indicated there is a national joined approach by all the National Parks – with the underlying message of following the Countryside Code.
- Million Mile Mountain Clean this is a week long campaign aimed at cleaning one million miles of mountains, rivers, beaches and streets to protect the environment from the growing problem of plastic pollution. The Mountain specific campaign that the BMC is

supporting in partnership with Surfers Against Sewage runs from the 15th - 23rd May when we hope to maximise publicity. This coincides with the Friends of the Lakes clean up weekend.

 - "Pack it in Pack it Out" idea in the US some years ago
- 6. Access and related Issues (James Bumby)
 - Additional Bird Restrictions on some crags notably Raven Crag, Walthwaite which apart from one exception climbers seem to be acknowledging.
 - Goats Crag Watendlath access issue Access Reps working with NT Ranger and farmer - for alternative access
 - Shepherds Crag
 - O Enquiries re additional car parking have drawn a blank!!
 - Kings Meaburn
 - Tree which became lodged at the crag has now been removed by forestry contractors
 - Funded 50% by the landowner and 50% by BMC.
