Decision taken by committee to appointment one as Members Council rep, and one as understudy to Mick Green (succession planning)

Richard Eden voted in as understudy to Mick Green (13 Y, 0 N, 0 A)

### 6. Members Council Update Mick Green

- 6.1 The members council wants to improve the connection between the Board, Areas and Membership, so this is a current topic of discussion.
- 6.2 Mick wants to propose a motion to the Members Council that we create a pipeline for volunteers as succession planning rather than trying to fill gaps when they occur. Motion was passed to take this to the council, and indeed in Yorkshire we have now started to do this ourselves

#### 7. Reports from Area Representatives

- 7.1 Gritstone: Access and Conservation covered by Nigel Baker
- 7.1.1.1 Baildon Bank clean up a success, thanks to all the attendees and Gecko chalk.
- 7.1.1.2 Alsmcliff path is holding up nicely, needs some minor maintenance work which is being looked in to
- 7.1.1.3 Issues highlighted this week at Snowdon crag, with grease being applied to holds. Belief is that this is linked to parking, and possibly lamping, which is disturbing the houses opposite. At least one report also suggested tyre slashing. Action taken for reps to call round to the houses and try and understand in more detail (Jim to contact Mick, Will to contact Jess).
- 7.1.1.4 Proposal is to use Gunk to remove the grease, but not clear what impact this will have on the rock.
- 7.1.1.5 Possible suggestion for some signage in the area, but for now please park on the Blubberhouses road.
- 7.1.1.6 Hetchell Woods has been marked with permanent marker for tick marks, situation to be monitored but BMC team would appreciate a local volunteer to clean/inspect the rock
- 7.1.1.7 Tyres being slashed also reported at Running Hill Pits, messages passed onto North West area.

### 7.2 Limestone: Access and Conservation Nigel Baker

- 7.2.1 Paul Clarke continues his good work at Trow Gill after the storm damage, with permission received for some tree surgery from BMC and estate owners. A small group will be needed to support the clear-up in early May, and then routes and anchors will need checking.
- 7.2.2 Nesting season is upon us, so everyone needs to be aware, including at Malham. Langcliffe, Skyline and Upper Stoney Bank have no restrictions as birds have not nested, possibly related to the trees having grown too big.
- 7.2.3 Blue scar access issues continue (permit required), but a second farmer may be able to offer a possible solution in the future. Currently there is a bird ban due to nesting anyway.
- 7.2.4 Lots of new routes at Attermire Scar in the lower grades, great support from the Farmer.

- 8.1 2022 AGM is on Wed 18<sup>th</sup> May via zoom, proxy votes are available.
- 8.2 We will be proposing the addition of an "Object" to the Articles as follows:
- 8.2.1 "Encourage and promote membership of the BMC to Mountaineers and those interested in mountaineering". This will be put forward as a separate resolution.

We are doing this in order to ensure that we can grow membership, and thus become more representative of the millions of people in England and Wales who already enjoy our sports – activities. Our intent is that this will help us engage with underrepresented groups in within our sports – activities – for instance women and girls and ethnic minorities.

- 8.3 Tough financial year, running at a loss in 2021, but expect to recover in 2023.
- 8.4 Hope is to work closer with Sport England, ABC and NICAS, with the BMC recently receiving a its Sports England grant.
